The fund-raiser is just a part of the Frisselles dedication to using racing to promote a variety of causes, as the two are frequent visitors to hospitals in race markets. Burt and Brian paid a visit to the Columbus Children's Hospital just this week in advance of the EMCO Gears Classic at the Mid-Ohio Sports Car Course. The Frisselles are also significant supporters of the Lupus Foundation. Both Burt and Brian have visited Camp Boggy Creek before, and were deeply impressed not only by the program the camp has developed, but more so by the determination and spirit of those who attend.

"These kids are really incredible," said Burt. "Brian and I can get frustrated sometimes when things don't go our way on the track because we want to win so much. Spending time here reminds us of how badly these young kids want to win the tremendous battles that they face and are fighting so bravely. It's humbling, because the obstacles that these children face are great, but Burt and I leave Camp Boggy Creek feeling excited for what the kids are experiencing at the camp."

The two Frisselle brothers have a long history of competition with each other, and relish the chance to raise funds and awareness while fueling their competitive fire.

"Camp Boggy Creek gives these kids a chance to just be kids by taking the focus off their health issues and filling their days here with fun activities," said Brian. "So to be able to help out with that, even in a small way, is something that we feel lucky to have the chance to do. And, there is no question-- I am going to beat Burt in golf!"
